

Introduction

Throughout this last twelve months we have continued to explore God's will for us as a church and we have tried to work that out day by day. We believe that our calling is to bring glory to Jesus because of who he is and what he's done for us, and so our first priority is to know him better, to be open to experience his presence among us by his Spirit and to listen faithfully to his word to us. Our worship, when we come together as God's people and through the offering of our lives, is always a response to what God has done and is doing.

We work out our calling to bring glory to God by seeking to make disciples who make disciples. If Jesus really is Lord of all the earth, as we claim, we want to see all people worshipping at his throne. One of the main emphases throughout this last year, therefore, has been 'fruitfulness on the frontline' – the desire to make Jesus known by our words and actions to the people we meet naturally in our daily lives. Our aim is to bless them in any way we can and, therefore, we begin by praying for God's opportunities, listen to others' stories, eat and drink with them, serve them in ways that are appropriate and then share our story of faith with them.

We also work out our calling by growing more like Jesus ourselves, and we are currently reviewing the way we do that through our small groups. I am very grateful to Rick Hemmings, who has been our housegroup coordinator for the last 10 years, for his zeal for small groups in the church's life. Members clearly value the groups greatly – in at least one case, it is the support of the group which has meant they are still part of All Saints. As well as being accountable to one another for the way we grow as Christians, we want to support one another on our frontlines through the groups.

I hope that, as you read this snapshot of the last twelve months at All Saints, you will catch a sense of God's purposes for us being worked out in different ways, and I hope that you will feel encouraged to give yourself afresh to the work to which he has called all of us.

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${f A}$ lpha (Beta and Beta Plus)

The Alpha (Beta and Beta Plus) ministry has continued to see people exploring faith in Christ and learning to read the Bible and deepening their faith. However, there were occasions when there were more people cooking and helping than the number of leaders and guests, and we thought about how to simplify the structure. One of the problems was trying to fit courses in for those for whom Thursday evening was not a possibility. To that end we ran an Alpha Team Training Evening, hoping to recruit people who would host and/or lead an Alpha course at other times. A number of people stepped up to the mark, but this time no one came forward asking to do Alpha at any other time.

In September 2015, we joined with Northgate and Freedom Church to hold an Alpha Taster event held at Northgate with Andy Kind (a Christian, professional stand-up comedian who has performed at Spring Harvest). It was a good evening and 5 people signed up with us to do Alpha and they completed the course. Meanwhile, Ron trialled Freedom in Christ as a Beta/Beta Plus with those who had completed Christianity Explored in June.

We also wanted to find a simpler arrangement for catering. Two suggestions were made:- soup, cheese and cake after the style of Lent Suppers and One Pot Meals. Once again we were blessed by people providing meals in either style, whilst Helen G. and Stephen B. looked after the hard work in the kitchen. All the meals were enjoyed but there was a mixed feeling about what was best.

In January, the Freedom in Christ course continued, the Alpha group moved on to Christianity Explored and Stephen and Helen were going to be leading the new Alpha. We needed a catering co-ordinator. Yvonne offered to recruit helpers, whilst Andy Warren offered to do the catering. Alpha food has been transformed with dishes like South African Babouti, Moroccan Meatballs and Sausage Gnocci appearing on the menu. Donations from the guests and leaders have partly met the cost, which Andy has kept in check, and housegroups have blessed us by sending a couple of folks (organised by Yvonne) to help in the kitchen each evening. Andy has agreed to lead the catering for the next term, for which we are very grateful.

In the meantime, Sam set up an Alpha for men on a Monday night at The Piper, and saw a number of men go through the Alpha course. He is recommending the downloaded talks for future use but we will need computers and the HDMI leads to connect to the TVs in order to use these in All Saints.

All the courses have now completed and we are looking forward to the start of the next term on April 21st. Freedom in Christ will run again and we look to see more people signing up for Alpha, as Church members boldly invite those on their frontlines.

work load is great and Lily has recently stepped up to leading activities and even doing some of the talks. Not only Lily but Katy D-H has begun to help with the leadership at Minis. Katy is a primary teacher and so she is very able and gifted in leading. She has encouraged me to set up a "Minis Support and Pray" group which meets every term and is aimed at getting the Christian mums from Minis together to support each other not only in being a mum but in being a Christian mum at Minis, gently sharing our faith to their friends at Minis.

I am also grateful to Paula Warren, who, from her background working with babies and children in a day Nursery, has thrown herself into helping both on Mondays and Fridays either in the kitchen or on the craft table where she chats to the children and their parents/carers so easily. What a wonderful team has come together this year!

I also have to mention the other parents who help at Minis – some come early to finalise preparations for the morning, others tidy away at the end, there are those who help at our 'altogether time' by leading the Blessing song for each child or running our song time 'finale'.

I believe that, between us, we continue to provide a lovely welcoming group for the families who come as well as a support for those who are finding parenting difficult at times.



Dinkies is the group specifically aimed at parents and their babies (i.e. those not yet walking). We currently have about 30 mums and their babies on the Register. Dinkies is not as structured as Minis – we offer refreshments during the course of the afternoon and end the time with 15 minutes of singing nursery rhymes

and other songs.

The team at the moment includes Lily, Hilary Shergold (kitchen) and the long-standing Andrea Wood.

Schools Groups

We continue to help children at St. Werburghs and Hoole Primary grow in confidence and drama skills through Just4fun workshops and the performance of sketches. The Building Committee is a sub-committee of the PCC, made up of PCC members and others with an interest in the buildings and fabric of the church and other properties. It is both our privilege and responsibility to look after all of the PCC's building portfolio. To this end, we all consider our role is to ensure that the Church and other buildings are kept in the best possible condition for the current and future needs of God's people here in Hoole, to use to his praise and glory.

Over the last year we have not had any major projects to report on but we have continued with numerous day-to-day repairs and redecoration jobs that are done on an ad-hoc basis and we regularly have smaller projects running.

Our Quinquenial inspection was due in 2015, but as I write we are still waiting for a date from the architect for this. Our lightning conductor failed its inspection this year and we have appointed a contractor to do the necessary repairs and alterations. This work was due to be done first week in March but due to staff shortages caused by illness it was delayed but the work is imminent. We could not find a suitable LED light for the inside of the Church but will continue to look as LED technology develops.

The urgent items highlighted by the survey of the old Westminster Road School, have been completed by our tenant (CWaC) and we are waiting for them to produce a schedule for the less important items.

As always, if you would like more information about the work of the committee, just ask one of its members, and if you have an idea as to how we can improve the buildings, please let us know and we will look at it.

As we enter our third year of operation it's amazing to see the changes that have taken place since we launched for a six-week trial in the spring of 2013.

Long gone are the days when we had to set up and take down each day, had access only to a tiny counter-top fridge and a plug-in cool box and the only storage space available to us was in the bowels of the church boiler room.

Despite the initial trials and tribulations Craft Café continues to grow and provide a much-needed service to its users. Among our regulars are a large number of mums from St Martins, Minis and Dinkies mums, residents from Gosforth Place and our 'Bingo Ladies' (Hoole Veterans) and our many, many church family customers. We also have many customers who are visitors to Chester and staying in the nearby hotels and B&Bs and even returning guests from all over the country who call in when they're in Chester.

Of course we also welcome the lost, the lonely and the broken and work hard to build up relationships with people in need of comfort and support and provide a space where they feel welcome and can see God's love in action throughout the community.

From only opening three days a week, we now operate five days a week (although Wednesdays are only for BSF) and our accounts clearly show not only our growing turnover but also demonstrate how seriously we regard financial management so we can continue to provide this essential frontline service without becoming a financial burden on the church.

Of course, none of this would be possible without our incredible team of hardworking volunteers whose relentless enthusiasm, grace and commitment has turned the café into the haven it is today. Thank you all!

Thanks also to those not officially on the care group 'books' but whose support ensures all requests are met, which mostly involves lifts to Church on Sundays. For many years Anne gave her time so willingly, taking over as Coordinator when required, even changing her work days at times to meet requests of church family. A truly remarkable lady.

We are always looking for new volunteers to join the Care Group. Support can be from just a few times a year to more regular volunteering, depending on your availability and which services you would like to take on.

Our mission for next year is to continue to support our church family and pray that no request is refused due to lack of availability of volunteers.

We have had another wonderful year in Pathfinders and Franks with some really great series and great times away. Last May we took the Pathfinders away for the second time. It was a fantastic weekend in Wales which included photo hunts, games and teaching from Acts. It culminated in a trip to 'Bounce Below' which although a little scary to begin with was fantastic fun.

Last summer saw Peri, Sam and Hanna Ellis travel to New Wine to serve on the team. Later in the summer we all travelled back to Shepton Mallet for Soul Survivor. It was really exciting to meet with Jesus and see lives touched by his love.

We had a great fireworks night which went off with a very safe and risk-assessed bang. We accompanied the night with worship, bringing 70+young people together from across the city to sing God's praise.

January was our *Encounter* weekend and this year seven churches from Chester joined us. Our theme was 'the storms of life' and we looked at how Jesus is our constant in hard times and good. It was amazing to see lives changed and we received some encouraging testimonies of what God had done.

February saw us put on *Engage*, which is four days of mission, worship, word and ministry. We had 70+ young people and leaders from across the city come together to serve Hoole. We hosted it at All Saints and it was a real pleasure to see young people going out and spreading the love of Jesus.

We had a couple of notable series studies this year which have really made an impact. 'Current Affairs' was a look at things that the church wrestles with and what the young people wanted to study in more depth. In Pathfinders we have done both 'Youth Alpha' and 'Freedom in Christ' courses. 'Fruitfulness on the Frontline' was really helpful in showing how easy mission is, what it is and where it happens. We had some amazing

feedback from our young people on that one. Finally, we are currently in a series called 'Friends with God' looking very practically at spiritual disciplines and how we can grow in our relationship with God. We had an exciting development in Pathfinders this year as we now meet two to three times a month in café.com in Hoole. We have also more recently spent time watching films about how God is moving around the world, to inspire our faith and encourage us to go for it.

My thanks go to my amazing team, Peri and this year Matt and Lily (our interns), also to Rachel, Matt and Becs for all they've done. Finally, to the youth workers of Chester for the amazing linked-up work that has happened this year.

Housegroups

The housegroups exist to provide a place where we can develop as disciples of Jesus by meeting together in small groups. They provide a vitally important opportunity to learn and grow together as we study the Bible, pray and worship. They are also a place where we can provide pastoral care for one another, which is particularly important in a large church like All Saints.

We have continued this year to study the same themes and passages as we look at in our morning services, with the exception of the autumn term at the end of last year. Over the past 12 months we have explored some very varied material. In the summer of 2015 we did a series on 'Who is my neighbour – disciplines for life'

looking at spiritual disciplines such as prayer and giving. In the autumn, we departed from the usual link between sermons and studies, and did the LICC course 'Fruitfulness on the Frontline', which was a mix of DVD and studies. In this spring term we are now looking at a series from John 13 to 16 entitled 'Jesus and his friends' as we move towards Easter. We have continued our approach of producing a course booklet for each term for each person attending, which has been a great success and thank you again to Anita Benson who has prepared these for us.

We currently have 12 groups, the same as last year, although one group, now led by Christina and Stephen Beveridge has changed from being a daytime group to meeting on Tuesday evening and is currently recruiting! Of the 12 groups, nine meet on various days in the evening (two on Tuesday, five on Wednesday and two on Thursday), and three meet during the day.

After a 10 year stint as housegroup coordinator, I decided it was time to stand down at the end of last year, so if you are not in a group already and would like to be, please see John Kirkland [for the time being].

Leadership Team

Open to God

Posada literally means "shelter" or "inn". It is the name given to an old Mexican tradition where, in the weeks leading up to Christmas, young people dressed as Mary and Joseph travelled from house to house asking for a room for the night and telling people about the imminent arrival of Jesus. On Christmas Eve they would visit the local church to re-



enact the nativity and place figures of Mary and Joseph in a crib scene.

Modern day Posada uses nativity figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey, who travel from place to place. This gives each 'host' the chance to create their own celebration in their home, worshipping, with the real message of Christmas and making room for Jesus in their lives.



During Advent last year the Posada was welcomed into over 25 homes of people from All Saints. The Posada basket not only contained knitted figures of Mary, Joseph and the donkey but there was also the Posada prayer, Christmas story book and a journey log. I know that a number of those involved enjoyed having a cup of tea and

chat together whilst handing over the Posada on the next part of its journey and it was a joy to celebrate the end of the Posada Journey when it arrived and was displayed at the Crib Service on Christmas Eve. Each Posada host household and also those who came to the Crib Service, received a knitted sheep made lovingly by many people from the Church family - many thanks!

Preaching Team

We continue to be grateful to all those who share in leading public worship and preaching at All Saints and, although one or two of our preachers are doing less now, it's been good to welcome new speakers like James Baird (who is exploring Reader ministry at the moment) to the team. As we did last year, we highly recommend Gary Chapman's book "Love Languages" which remains a favourite with Marriage Prep guests.
