OPEN DOORS - "We dream of a world in which every Christian who is persecuted is remembered and supported by other Christians."

Christians in many parts of the world continue to be exposed to persecution from loss of livelihood, homes and their lives. Below are a few examples on which to focus prayer and as an encouragement for us to actively support our Christian brethren who are suffering in many countries where governments do little to support them.

#### PLEASE PRAY

#### <u>Egypt</u>

4 teenage boys, all Christians, have recently been sentenced to 5 years in an adult prison for making a private video which has been interpreted as mocking Islam. The subject of the video was the activities of Islamic State.

President al Sisi who has been attempting to support Christians at a national level.

#### <u>Turkey</u>

For protection for Christians and Jews as it is reported that Islamic State is actively planning to attack churches and synagogues and to do so with a particular focus on children and young people.

#### <u>Pakistan</u>

Aasia Bibi, a Christian mother of 5 who continues (since 2010) to be on death row having been convicted of blasphemy.

Christians in Lahore where approx. 74 people were killed and more than 370 injured at an Easter celebration event in a park. There were some Muslims amongst the dead and injured.

### <u>Sudan</u>

Civil war in Sudan led to the new country of South Sudan being established (in 2011) the population of which is mainly Christian and Animist. The war has continued and it is estimated that 2.8 million people are now close to starvation.

#### <u>Nigeria</u>

More and more Christians are becoming displaced after Muslim Felani herdsmen attacked and killed 500 Christians in February.

#### Indonesia

20% of mission workers are reported to have given up due to pressure, loneliness and threats of imprisonment. Numerous regulations have been put in place to curb evangelism.

#### **Invitation**

Following John Benson's recent call for the church to pray for persecuted Christians worldwide, this is an invitation for those who can to meet in the Church Centre on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> April at 7.30pm to talk about how we might appropriately respond. The picture of a small boy lying face down in the sand on a Turkish beach last year really made me think what I could do to help those children who find themselves in desperate situations through no fault of their own. This is where I really need your help. On April 24th I will be running the London Marathon to raise funds for Save The Children. I'm aiming to raise £3,000.

In the UK alone Save The Children are aiding 1.6 million children who live in severe poverty. Being born into poverty dramatically reduces a child's chances of a better life.

Save the Children works in more than 120 countries to alleviate suffering, particularly from preventable diseases. Many succumb to preventable conditions and diseases and many die through malnutrition.

Save the Children responded to 97 emergencies in 54 countries delivering

Dear friends at All Saints,

I want to share with you why we are considering *Encountering God* in our sermons and housegroups this term. A few months ago I was in a meeting at which we discussed our corporate worship on Sunday mornings.



Several people commented that they were finding it a real struggle to engage with God during pubic worship, and we tried to explore why that was and what we could do about it.

I suspect that we might all give a slightly (or very!) different answer to that question, depending on our background and preferences, but we ended up talking about the kind of worship culture that God desires at All Saints. It is true, of course, that worship is a whole-life response to God and isn't just limited to what we do when we meet on a Sunday morning (see Romans 12:1,2 for example). It's also true that we come together to encourage one another and to spur one another on to love and good deeds (Hebrews 10:24,25) and not just to meet with God. But we do come together in the presence of God to hear his Word and to respond to him in repentance and faith, praise and thanksgiving, obedience and with the whole of our lives.

How then can we experience more of the presence of God in our lives and in our corporate worship? We recognise that we can't manufacture or command an encounter with God. God alone chooses when and how to reveal himself to his people and there is no technique by which we can guarantee it. But we believe it will help us to consider a number of encounters with God in the Bible. We will see how we can be more open to God revealing his presence as we meet. We will raise our sense of expectancy that God wants us to experience a greater intimacy with himself. We will be moved to pray that God will indeed visit us in his glory as we are gathered together.

Please will you then make this your prayer as you come on a Sunday morning: 'Lord, will you meet with us this morning? Will you grant us a greater awareness that you are present with us by your Spirit? Will you speak to us through your Word? Will you warm our hearts so that we may love and serve you in the whole of life?' As we all make that our prayer, I trust that the Lord will hear and answer our cry.
