Dear friends at All Saints,

Now the dust has begun to settle on the European Referendum, it's worth asking how we can pray as we go forward as a nation. Following the Archbishops' lead, I'd like to suggest several things we can pray for.



We can pray:

- For wisdom to know what God is calling us to be as a nation. The Archbishops ask "what values and virtues should shape and guide our relationships with others" in the years to come?
- That we will be "a generous and forward-looking country", remaining "hospitable and compassionate, builders of bridges and not barriers".
- That Britain will continue to seek the common good in Europe and in the world, "rejecting narrow nationalism and selfish individualism".
- For a national unity in which the divisions and cultural rifts which the referendum has exposed will be healed.
- For the fears of those whose vote reflected feelings of having been "left behind by current economic policies and politics" to be heard and understood, and for them to be addressed.
- For our neighbours, friends and work colleagues from overseas, who may be feeling fearful and insecure at the moment, to be reassured that their contribution to Britain is still valued.
- For Britons living and working abroad who are uncertain about what leaving the EU will mean for them.
- For those under 25 who mostly voted for Britain to remain to know that they have a significant future within Britain.
- For other European countries where sections of the population may feel motivated to follow Britain's lead.
- For the political will to tackle poverty, climate change and the refugee crisis. And, perhaps most of all as Christians, for the church's witness to God's will for unity, peace, reconciliation and love for neighbour, remembering that it's only in Christ that those virtues can truly be found.

To quote Tim Dakin, Bishop of Winchester, "I hope that we can come together by focusing on what unites rather than on what divides us. As Christians, we believe in the importance of sharing love and solidarity with our neighbours, at home and abroad, and our mission to live by these values remains unchanged."

PLEASE STOP AND READ

SHARE FOR PRAYER SECTION

"If one part [of the body] suffers, every part suffers with it."

1 Corinthians 12:26

Please stop for a moment and consider how you would feel and what you would hope for if what you read below described what is happening to Christians in your country.

A few examples of what life is like for Christians in Egypt:-

- For the second time in two weeks Christian homes were attacked and some set on fire when a rumour was started that one of a number of new houses being built by Christians was going to be converted to a church. Permission to build had only been given after the believers signed a pledge that none of the buildings being built would be used for "religious rituals."
- Regarding the building of places of worship a rule has been in place since 1856 that new church buildings cannot be constructed without the personal approval of the head of state.
- The kidnapping of young Christian women is a regular occurrence in response to which very little is done by the authorities. Recently it was reported that 7 women were kidnapped and forced to renounce their Christian beliefs and to marry.

Church buildings are regularly attacked and burned.

There have been recent reports of Christians being murdered in brutal ways following which little appears to have been done to identify the perpetrators or to protect others.

Please pray as the Holy Spirit leads you for Egyptian Christians and for those who don't condone what is happening but who often feel helpless to intervene.

Encouraging news.

- President Al-Sisi is reported to be taking initiatives to improve the lot of Christians including ordering the repair of damaged church buildings and beginning a process that will result in the implementation of a civil constitution that will give full rights to Christians.
- A group of Muslim people recently intervened to protect a church minister who was being physically attacked by a group of people.

Other news from nearer home.

- A weekly Sunday afternoon service in the Farsi language is being held in Liverpool Cathedral and is attended by between 100 and 140 people who are mainly refugees.
- Last year a quarter of all confirmations in the Bradford Diocese were of asylum seekers from Iran.

Alpha for the future – Alpha in the Community

The way All Saints is doing Alpha is changing. Alpha itself is changing.

Why?

In a changing world, it is harder to get people to commit to a weekly course. Shift work, family pressures and competing leisure activities all get in the way.

What is happening to Alpha?

1. Going Global

Global Launch this autumn – watch out for TV ads featuring Bear Grylls – a new High Definition Film series covering each of the Alpha talks. These have been recorded at various locations around the world with TV presenters: Toby Flint & Gemma Hunt (we saw Gemma at Spring Harvest), people like Jackie Pullinger, and Francis Collins: Director of the Human Genome Project all joining with Nicky Gumbel to make a first rate series of films.

2. Going Local

All the talks, training and question prompts are downloadable and can be run on a laptop or smart TV in places and at times to suit both hosts and guests.

What about All Saints?

We have run Alpha 3 times a year for about 12 years – we've had big groups and small groups – and over that time we've had other churches working with us sharing the load. For the last two years, All Saints has continued largely alone.

The leadership team has decided that we should change the way we do things from this September. Ron & Helen will be able to support the church though that change.

Fruitfulness on the Frontline, the Autumn House Group programme last year, showed us that we each have a frontline – those people we meet day by day, week by week who are not yet believers – people we can pray for, people we can invite for a social time and – maybe – invite to Alpha.

What will Ron & Helen and the Church Leadership do?

We have downloaded the material and will supply the manuals to resource All Saints people to run an alpha in a home or in a pub or café, or maybe book a room here in the church. Some people have already offered to host an Alpha in their home; some have offered to run an Alpha in someone else's home.

But I don't know enough to lead an Alpha

The filmed talks are the knowledge base. The list of questions to ask to start discussion is given in the Team Guide - all you need to do is to read them. And then provide a friendly environment in which discussion can take place. Maybe you can share your own personal story where appropriate.

Don't be afraid to say: "I don't know". Do offer to find out. Do ask our leaders, wardens, readers and preachers for help with the answers.

Ron & Helen will try to guide you or even come alongside you.

How do I go about it?

First Pray for your frontline people – watch out for God's guidance about who to approach. Invite and, if the invitation is accepted, decide a suitable time and location. (Note: You could meet daily, weekly, fortnightly, monthly – whatever is best for you and your guests) – **PS don't worry if the invitation is declined – just keep praying.**

Let Ron & Helen know – they will try to get you the resources you need.

It is good to have a second person alongside you when leading a group so again let Ron & Helen know and they will try their best to find someone.

Keep praying.

There is a trailer, and the first talk is designed a launch session, so you could just invite to that one session and then arrange further sessions if your quests would like to go further.

What do I need and what support will I have?

You will need a venue – your home, your guest's home, a café or pub, a room in the church centre – somewhere where both you and your guest/s will be comfortable.

You will need either a PC/laptop or a Smart TV with a USB input or simply a DVD player and an ordinary TV.

At some point you will need a Bible (or selection of Bibles) and pen and paper to write down any unanswered questions.

We will supply invites for you to give out; talk to Ron & Helen about this.

We will give you guidance about how to run sessions.

We will supply leaders guides and guest handbooks.

We will supply a customisable programme for you to use.

We will supply the teaching material on either DVD or Memory Stick, or you could download it vourself from the Internet.

We will advise you if you need a shorter form of the course.

We will endeavour to help you run Alpha if you need it.
