# **Prayer Focus**

For us to be a church that reaches out to the community, to engage with those parts of the parish that still need to know the good news of Jesus.

Dear friends at All Saints,

It's a time of preparation. The nursery must be got ready. The car seat must be bought. The clothes must be borrowed or given. For my daughter and her husband it's a time of preparation as they wait for their first child in January.



It's a time of preparation. The presents must be bought and wrapped. The tree must be found and the lights mended. The food must be ordered and cooked. For all of us it's a time of preparation as we wait for Christmas Day.

It's a time of preparation. The Father must prepare for the birth of his Son. The promises must be made to his people Israel, describing the character of his Son and telling them what he will do. The visual aids must be given, picturing why the Son must come to rescue his people. For the people of God throughout the Old Testament, it was a time of preparation for the coming of Christ.

We prepare because we believe that something will happen. The child will be born. Christmas will come. And then it happened.

God the Father's present to us has arrived. The gift of his own Son, born of Mary, laid in a manger, announced by angels, seen by shepherds, worshipped by foreign Magi.

But not just God's present to us. God present with us. Immanuel (which means, 'God is with us' says Matthew).

Present with that young couple celebrating the birth of their firstborn, just like Mary and Joseph in Bethlehem. Present with the refugees driven from their home, just like the Holy Family forced into exile for their own safety. Present with the grieving families, just like the people of Bethlehem, mourning after Herod had massacred all the boys under two. Present with the elderly whose hopes have just been fulfilled, like Anna and Simeon in Jerusalem as they saw the Christ-child.

Jesus. God's present to us today. But we need to receive him by faith.

Jesus. God present with us. But we must welcome him into our lives.



# Will you pray?

- Ethiopia the worst drought in decades has left millions of Ethiopians facing
  months of severe hunger and hardship. As a result there is a major food crisis
  looming. Tearfund say it is the people in poverty who in conflict (and other
  situations like drought) pay the highest price. Pray that needs will be met.
- India a) for the protection of Christians who are becoming increasingly vulnerable to a campaign of attacks and enforced 're-conversion' by Hindu radicals. b) for wisdom for church leaders struggling to get permission to build churches. Pray for good legal advice. c) Praise God for those strengthening the church through literacy and livelihood projects and biblical training.
- 3. UK for Muslims who have become Christians as there are increasingly reports of individuals being physically attacked and feeling they are not being welcomed or supported in churches. In Bradford, in the last two weeks, Nissar Hussain was attacked outside his home and suffered fractures to his hand and kneecap. He feels unsupported by police and church leaders in Bradford who will not acknowledge this happened as punishment for his becoming a Christian.
- 4. Tanzania 3 churches were destroyed by fire (arson) in November. Pray for the safety of Christians and their places of worship.
- OCC Shoebox Appeal This year Operation Christmas Child aims to send thousands more that they will all safely reach their intended destination and will bring much joy to the children who receive them.
