

Dear friends at All Saints,

We may feel we've had enough surprises for one year. After all, there was the EU Referendum in June which resulted in Brexit, which came as a big surprise to many. Then there was the American election result last month – which came as a considerable surprise to most people, certainly in Britain. I suspect we don't want too many surprises this Christmas; just the usual pair of socks or a bottle of perfume.

But Christmas is all about surprises. It's the story of God's Son coming in to the world he made – which is a massive surprise in itself; why would he want to do that? Surely it would have been far simpler to wipe it all out and start again on another planet elsewhere in the Universe? It's the story of a teenage single mum giving birth to the King of Kings and placing him in a feeding-trough in the part of the house where the smelly animals lived – surely he should be in a John Lewis crib in a Hampstead mansion? It's the story of God going first to some rather dubious shepherds with the news that the real Chosen One has been born, rather than sending the angel choir to make a guest appearance on a TV Chat Show. It's the story of the One in whom the 'hopes and fears of all the years' meet having to be rescued from the hatred and violence of a power-crazed dictator and taken as a refugee to Egypt.

And so we could go on, noting at each point that God didn't do what we would have expected. There's a saying which has become quite popular lately – 'I didn't see that one coming'; and if we're honest, and if we can put aside the over-familiarity of the story, we have to say that about Christmas. We didn't see it coming; no-one did; not like that.

But, and this is the point, that's God for you. He never does what we expect. He always takes us by surprise.

And the question for all of us this Christmas – and all year round, actually – is whether we are looking for God's surprises? Are we open to him taking us by surprise? Are we still listening for his word when he doesn't say quite what we expect him to? And are we ready to respond when the call comes out of the blue?

So, Happy Christmas – and I hope you get at least one surprise along with all the old familiar things.

Thank you to all who stayed for the 'bring and share' lunch last Sunday. It was a great encouragement that so many were able to do so. Thanks also to those who brought food which was, as usual, wonderful. The ministry in word and music at both services was very special and what we saw and heard in the afternoon a challenging blessing. To see how Christians old and young remain hopeful in the face of such adversity was very humbling.

News has emerged that in the USA the present administration took active steps to exclude Arab Christians living in the US from top federal jobs. Arab Christian leaders say that this news confirms what they had long suspected - that Arab Christians had been specifically excluded because they were not Muslims.

Christian children are not shielded from personal (as distinct to indiscriminate) persecution. It is reported that, in October, a 9 year old boy and his mother were arrested in Pakistan and falsely accused of blasphemy – burning pages from the Koran. They were released after 4 days of questioning following interventions from Christian and Muslim politicians. This is apparently far from being the only case of a Christian child or woman being targeted using the 'Blasphemy Laws.'

In Iraq several Christian villages formerly occupied by IS have been liberated recently. There is news of church leaders returning to ring the bells in their damaged churches or to restore the cross above their town. The liberation of these towns is a sign of hope for the Christians who once lived there. However, this is only the beginning as much needs to be done before people can return to live in their burnt out or seriously damaged homes.
