

The picture of a small boy lying face down in the sand on a Turkish beach last year really made me think what I could do to help those children who find themselves in desperate situations through no fault of their own. #### Dear friends at All Saints,

It doesn't seem very long since we were celebrating Christmas and yet, within a few days, it will be Lent. Lent is a time for examining ourselves, repenting and seeking the grace of God's Spirit to live



Christlike lives. As the apostle Peter wrote, 'I urge you, as aliens and strangers in the world, to abstain from sinful desires, which wage war against your soul.' [1 Peter 2:11]

Peter recognised that there are in all of us desires which, if we don't wage war against them, will destroy our soul with terrible consequences. It's easy to think of those desires in terms of sexual lust or the desire for an excess of alcohol or some other stimulant, but often the sinful desires are more subtle and respectable. We follow the siren voices of our culture and desire the kind of life we see pictured in the adverts.

But Peter calls us to 'abstain' from giving in to those desires. To avoid giving them headspace. To replace them with something positive and good. And he tells us to do that so that we may '*Live such good lives among the unbelievers that... they may see your good deeds and glorify God on the day he visits us*' [1 Peter 2:12].

Peter's concern is that we will bring glory to our loving heavenly Father who gave his Son to rescue us from the destructive work of sin. We do that, he says, not just by changing our behaviour, but by addressing our desires. That's where we need to start in Lent. Not just by giving up chocolate or alcohol for a few weeks, helpful though some people find that, but by taking up the fight at the level of our desire for that which is contrary to God's will.

And Peter helps us to do that by reminding us who we are. We are 'aliens and strangers in the world'. The greatest truth about us is not that we are British citizens but that we belong to Jesus. What matters ultimately is not British values but Christ's values. That's where we need to put our focus so that, more and more, our desire will not be for the life the world offers, but for the life that Jesus gives, both here and in eternity.

OPEN DOORS - "We dream of a world in which every Christian who is persecuted is remembered and supported by other Christians."

#### A matter for praise.

Can you name a country in Europe where the government wants Christianity openly taught in schools? Or where a small denomination (Baptist) has contact with 1% of the nation's children every school day?

The answer is perhaps surprising – Hungary. Three years ago the government changed the law, allowing state schools to become church schools. Nearly 50 schools have since become "Baptist schools. Almost overnight a denomination with 12,000 members was responsible for some 17,000 students and 2,000 teachers

## Will you pray?

- 1. That children everywhere will not be denied the opportunity of hearing the gospel for themselves and that Christians will not be prevented by their governments from talking openly about faith in Jesus.
- 2. Barnabas Fund has identified that there are more converts from Islam to Christianity than ever before. Many of these new Christians face serious persecution. Prayer is a tool that we can use to support them.
- 3. That the erosion of Christianity, particularly in the Middle East, because of the widespread persecution of the Church, will be halted.
- 4 That Albanian church leaders and their families many of whom have very little contact with other church leaders will have opportunities for support and fellowship.

## Focus on Kenya

Christians in Kenya are suffering because of an increase in radical Islam as fundamentalist forms of Islam champion the grievances of Muslims against the government and are building hostility towards the other, non-Islamic communities. Pray that –

- The government will act wisely.
- The supply of arms will be stemmed.
- That moderate Muslims, of whom there are many and who have generally lived in peace with Christians, will not be intimidated to join in the violence and persecution which is on the increase.

## Letter from Jane Dawson

Hello all,

I'm delighted to let you know that Chester Mystery Plays and Theatre in the Quarter are working together (with Churches Together in Chester City Centre and Link Up) to produce a City Passion, based on the 2008 Chester Mystery Plays script on the morning of Good Friday (25 March 2016).

Matt Baker will be artistic/music director. He will be pulling together three short pieces - entry to Jerusalem and the Last Supper; the Trial; the Crucifixion - to form the City Passion which will be performed in three city centre locations (the Cross, outside the Town Hall, outside the West door of the Cathedral).

We are all really excited about this collaboration which will be a great curtainraiser for the 2018 production of the Chester Mystery Plays! If it goes well (and of course it will!), the hope is that it will be produced annually. As always - we need you! We are looking for people to join the chorus (which will double as the crowd/s), actors to play a few characters and musicians. All those involved would be volunteers.

**Chorus:** you don't have to have been involved before or to know the music - there will be a few rehearsal sessions. Anyone over 16 who wants to be involved in the chorus can be (provided you have a reasonable singing voice!), but you must be prepared to double as the crowd.

Actors: there are only a few parts and the main focus is on the music rather than the spoken word, so we can't guarantee that everyone who auditions can be involved (unless you also sing and would like to be in the chorus).

**Musicians:** you will be "unplugged"! We hope to accommodate everyone who is interested, but your instrument/s must be portable You do have to be prepared to perform outdoors, whatever the weather, and to move from the Cross to the Town Hall and the West door. We cannot provide seating.

If you would like to be involved, please respond to this email indicating whether you would like to be in the chorus, play a character or be a musician (or any combination) and I will put you onto a distribution list to receive further information, updates etc. If you don't wish to be involved there's no need to do anything - I will only get back in touch with those who have expressed an interest.

The draft rehearsal schedule (subject to change!) is as follows: Monday 1 February from 6pm Main Character auditions Friday 5 February 6 - 9pm Read through and music rehearsal Saturday 13 February 9.30 - 11am Music rehearsal Friday 26 February 6 - 9pm Main Characters Friday 11 March 6 - 9pm Main characters Sunday 13 March 1 - 4pm full group rehearsal Friday 18 March 6 - 9pm main characters Sunday 20 March 1 - 4pm full group rehearsal Wednesday 23 March 6 - 8pm final rehearsal Friday 25 March 9am call (and final run through) for 10.30 performance
