# Chester City Passion

## Good Friday, 14 April 2017 10.30am on the streets of Chester City Centre Free event

After the hugely successful production of the Chester City Passion last Easter, Chester Mystery Plays in association with Churches Together, Theatre in the Quarter and Link Up have agreed to mount this astonishing performance once more on the streets of Chester on Good Friday, 14 April 2017.

Those involved last year were astounded and profoundly moved by the number of people who came into the City to watch the story of Christ's passion unfold. The company used Chester's streets and rows as a theatre, telling the story from Jesus' entry into Jerusalem (under the Eastgate Clock) to the Crucifixion outside the West Door of the Cathedral. The 100 strong community cast was joined by children from local schools, Roman Soldiers, Karamba Samba and the Town Crier.

"So many people expressed a desire for this unique production to be seen again," commented Jo Sykes, Chairman of the Chester Mystery Plays Company. "We all felt we should make it happen despite the inevitable funding difficulties."

Matt Baker will return to direct the production and his music will once again be heard on the streets of Chester. "I'm really happy to be able to be a part of this very special event again" said Matt, "and to use our fantastic city centre as a backdrop. We'll be hoping for the glorious weather we had last time to make it perfect!"

Andy Glover of Link-Up added: "the Chester City Passion was a wonderful project to be involved in. The churches across the city worked together with the Mystery Plays and Theatre in the Quarter to produce a spellbinding celebration of theatre and faith. We are really looking forward to doing it again and to welcoming thousands of people to this exceptional event."

Dear friends at All Saints,

I've never been one for making New Year Resolutions – for one thing, I know I can never keep them – but as we begin 2017 I want to remind us of the kind of people we believe God wants us to be at All Saints.



Firstly we want to be a people who live with Jesus. In one sense we are always 'with Christ'. As believers we are united with Christ. We died with Christ, we have been raised with Christ, our life is hidden with Christ, and one day we shall appear with Christ when he comes to reign (see Colossians 2:20, 3:1-4). But I'm thinking more of the need to spend time in his presence day by day, delighting in him and depending on him for all we need. There are many spiritual disciplines which help us to do that, but especially we read the Bible and ask what each passage shows us of the glory of Jesus, and we fix our eyes upon him as we spend time in prayer. Just as we want to spend much time with Jesus.

Next we want to be a people who live *like Jesus*. The more time we spend gazing upon the beauty and loveliness of Jesus, the more we shall become like him. Paul tells us that 'We all, who with unveiled faces contemplate the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit' (2 Corinthians 3:18). One of the best descriptions in the New Testament of what it means to live like Jesus is the Fruit of the Spirit in Galatians 5:22, 23. It is, first and foremost, a description of the character of Jesus. And it is that character which the Holy Spirit is working to produce in us as he transforms us day by day.

And finally we want to be a people who live *for Jesus*. Paul says that *'Christ's love compels us'*, (2 Corinthians 5:14, 15). We see his love in that he died for us and was raised again, and our response is that we no longer live for ourselves but for him. All that we do, we do for Christ. We live for him at work, at home and at church. Our obedience is for him. Our desire to be fruitful on our frontlines is for him. Our suffering is for him.

All for Jesus, all for Jesus! This our song shall ever be: You our only hope, our saviour, Yours the love that sets us free' H. Bonar

May God help us to be a people who live with, like and for Jesus more and more in 2017.

Asia Bibi, a mother of five, has just spent her seventh consecutive Christmas in prison in Pakistan despite global protests. Baroness Cox, UK crossbench peer has said recently, "Only those of us in open and free societies can be a voice to the voiceless and Christmas is the perfect season for us to renew our appeal for humanity and tolerance." Please raise your voice in prayer for Asia Bibi and her husband and children.

Open Doors are holding a World Watch Event on 11.01.17 in Parliament to which MPs have been invited. Open Doors will be highlighting the link between the persecution of Christians and displacement. Prayer support for this event is requested and in particular that MPs will respond positively to invitations to attend. Also, pray for Rt Hon Theresa Villiers MP who is hosting the event.

Christians are returning to previously abandoned towns, cities and homes. Notably to Qaraqosh nr Mosul, Iraq where the return began in November 2016 and to Homs, Syria where, since the Syrian government liberated the city, Christians have been gradually returning after absences lasting several years. Pray that much needed support will be made available to enable the families to re-build their homes and lives. Also, pray that children will be able to return to their schools and be educated without fear.

As we pray this month please remember to praise God as well. Tim Keller writes, "When your soul through grace begins to praise God, you come into harmony with the rest of the universe, which is also singing. Your redeemed voice contributes its own unique chord and adds to the overwhelming beauty. Praise unites us also with one another. Here is 'the only potential bond between extremes of mankind: joyful preoccupation with God.' Praise the Lord."
