The picture of a small boy lying face down in the sand on a Turkish beach last year really made me think what I could do to help those children who find themselves in desperate situations through no fault of their own. Dear friends at All Saints,

'Can anything separate us from the love of God?' That was the question we asked the other Sunday morning, expecting the answer 'No'. Someone suggested that our sin can separate us from God's love and, although we tried to give an answer to that in the service, I think it might be helpful to expand on it a little.



Firstly, it is true that sin separates us from God and his love. Isaiah tells us that 'It's your sins that have cut you off from God. Because of your sins, he has turned away and will not listen anymore' [Isaiah 59:2]. Sin reveals itself in many different ways but, in essence, it's our failure to give God his rightful place in our lives; it's the unbelief which worships other things or other people rather than the living God. Because of that sin, everyone is guilty before God and everyone is separated from his love and everyone needs rescuing if they are to have a relationship with God and enjoy his love.

It's for that reason, supremely, that God's Son Jesus came into the world and died on the cross. There he took the punishment that our sin deserved, being separated from his Father as he cried out on Good Friday, '*My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?*' At that moment he was shut out of God's presence in order that we might enter in.

Secondly, therefore, it's because Jesus died in our place that believers can never be separated from God and his love. When we turn from our unbelief and trust Jesus and what he did for us, we are accepted by God; now when God looks at us he sees us clothed with the perfection of Christ; we are free for ever from being condemned [Romans 8:1]. We may still sin, we may feel that we have failed as Christians, we may hear the voice of Satan telling us we are condemned and separated from God's love, but we are *in Christ*, and nothing *'will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord'* [See Romans 8:31 -39].

Thirdly, we may not always feel God's love. There may be many reasons for that, including the knowledge that we have committed *that sin* again. It's true that we need to confess our sin to God and ask his help to turn away from it, but it's not true that God has stopped loving us or that we have been separated from his love when that happens. We are still *in Christ* through faith in him. If we were run down by a number 99 bus before we had time to repent, God would still welcome us into his presence as his child.

As we celebrate Good Friday and Easter this month, let's ask ourselves several questions. Am I *in Christ*? That is, have I put my trust in Jesus and his death to rescue me from being separated from God? Is there any sin I need to repent of as a believer in order that I may enjoy more fully the reality of God's love in my life? And am I rejoicing that nothing, not even my sin, can separate me from the love God has for all those who are in Christ Jesus?

CHESHIRE ON FILM AT THE GROSVENOR MUSEUM

Archive film showing quirky local traditions and fascinating daily life in and around Cheshire over the last hundred years will be screened at the Grosvenor Museum this March.

'Cheshire on Film' is a specially selected compilation of films from The North West Film Archive at Manchester Metropolitan University. They are being screened as part of its programme to make this captivating collection available to the public of the North West region.

There will be two separate screening for people to enjoy on Tuesday March 8 at 2pm and 7.30pm.

The footage includes views of Edwardian life in Chester in 1907 and shows the women of Neston on their annual Ladies Walking Day of 1910. The last of Chester's trams are seen running through the city in 1930 and in 1942 the children of Elworth are recorded as they adapt to School life in Wartime. A trip along the Weaver Navigation sees the world famous Anderton Boat Lift in operation, and delicate silk fabrics produced in Macclesfield are turned into fine cloth in Colour in Silk from 1954.

Join the residents of Ellesmere Port as their refuse collections are revolutionised in 1961 and see how the County's famous Cheshire Cheese is produced on a farm at Mollington in 1980 in an episode of the BBC's Homeground series.

Councillor Louise Gittins, Cabinet Member for Culture Leisure and Wellbeing said: "This is a great opportunity for the people of Chester and the local area to enjoy an afternoon or evening with a difference, and take a look back at life in and around Cheshire in the past century". Focus on Pakistan.

Tensions are high in Pakistan following the execution of a Muslim man for killing the governor of Punjab for whom he was his bodyguard. The governor had spoken out against the countries harsh blasphemy laws, arguing that they discriminate against religious minorities. He also called for a pardon for Asia Bibi, a Christian woman who was sentenced to death in 2010 for blasphemy, which she denies. Tensions are now running high.

There has been a call for Christians to "...., please keep Pakistan in your prayers. I suspect there will be repercussions for our brothers and sisters in Pakistan over the recent execution ..."

Will you pray?

For protection for Christians in Pakistan For the swift release of Asia Bibi For a change in Pakistan's blasphemy laws

In addition it is reported that in recent times 11,550 Pakistani Christians have entered Thailand seeking asylum. They have not been welcomed and hundreds are held in Bangkok's filthy and overcrowded immigration detention centres, while others are simply thrown in jail.

Please pray for provision and strength for the Pakistani Christians in Thailand.

Other items for praise and prayer.

Praise

- that the authorities in Turkey have overturned an order banning 4 different congregations sharing the one church building in Bursa. The building has been used for Christian worship since the 1880s. It's reported that approx 200 people meet there weekly for worship.
- That 43 Syrian Christians who were being held captive by IS have been released.

<u>Pray</u>

- that those released who have all lost both their houses and their livings will be provided for.
- For Christians in Cameroon who are suffering almost daily at the hands of Boko Haran identified as the deadliest jihadi group in the world.


