Lent Supper Fruit Cake Recipe

Ingredients for 1 x 8" deep tin or 2 smaller sandwich tins

10 oz self raising flour 2 eggs

8 oz margarine/butter 8 oz soft dark brown sugar 1 lb mixed fruit 4 oz chopped glacé cherries

Small tin of Carnation milk

Cream the margarine or butter and sugar. Add the beaten eggs and mix. Add flour and mix well. Add fruit and cherries and mix. Add the Carnation milk and mix. Spoon mixture into greased tin/s and cook for 2 1/2 to 3 hours on gas mark $1/120^{\circ}$ C, or until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Cool in the tin, and turn out.

WARMER HOMES AND CHEAPER BILLS FOR CHESHIRE WEST RESIDENTS

Warm Zones CIC is working in partnership with Cheshire West and Chester Council to help residents make their homes warmer and to reduce fuel bills.

The Warm Zone fund is offering the following improvements; replacement boilers and central heating systems (that are broken and uneconomical to repair or over 20 years old), new heating systems, loft Insulation and cavity wall insulation.

There is no cost to residents and all works will be carried out free of charge. Residents do not need to be claiming a benefit or be unemployed to have the work done; they just need to live in a specific postcode area.

Eligible areas include certain postcodes within the following; CH1, CH2, CH3, CH4, CH65, CH66, CW7, CW8, CW9, WA6 localities. This opportunity is open to home owners and private tenants, subject to landlord's permission.

Councillor Mark Henesy, Cabinet Member for Environment and Community said: "We are delighted to be working with Warm Zones to offer these free energy measures to local homes that need help to bring their heating systems up to scratch. This will not only help residents to make their homes much warmer but will also reduce their household energy bills."

For help with heating or insulation if you live within one of the eligible areas please contact Warm Zones on 0800 033 7967 or 0121 552 0563. There is limited funding available and work will be completed on a first come first served basis.
