Dear friends at All Saints,

I know we all have our different patterns when it comes to reading the Bible and organising our prayer life, but I thought it might help someone if I share my current pattern.



I have used various ways of reading the Bible over the years — as a new Christian and a student I was encouraged to use *Search the Scriptures*, which is still available in a revised edition. Using a question and answer approach it takes you through the Bible in three years, although I have to confess that it took me a lot longer as I didn't manage to read it every day and I sometimes broke off to use other methods. At other times I have read through the whole Bible in a year using the Murray M'Cheyne method, read the Bible alongside a commentary like *The Bible Speaks Today* series, which now covers every book of the Bible and lots of themes as well, or worked through different books myself. At the moment I am enjoying using *Explore*, Bible reading notes from *The Good Book Company* which are available both in print and as an eBook. The important thing is to think about what the passage means and how it applies to my life.

When it comes to prayer, I have recently discovered the PrayerMate app. It's a great way of organising my prayer topics into various headings – e.g. my family, All Saints, people I want to come to faith, those I have promised to pray for, etc. It allows me to create my own headings and then populate them with prayer points; I can receive regular updates from mission organisations; I have downloaded various prayers which I can use, like the Anglican special prayer for the day and various Bible prayers. I choose how many topics I want to pray for each day and it picks from my list as I scroll through it. I'm finding it really helpful and it's available for both iOS and android devices.

The other thing I have just done — and I will let you know how I get on with it — is to buy a Study Bible. I have always thought I have enough commentaries not to need a Bible with study notes included alongside the text, but a ministerial friend was enthusing about the Gospel Transformation Bible recently and I succumbed. His review praised the way it is good at showing how the passage I'm reading fits into the big story of God's plan of salvation and how that applies to our lives now. I bought it while it was on offer from 10ofThose and I got an eBook version thrown in free.

But even if you don't do any of the things I do, reading God's Word and responding in praise and prayer is key to keeping our relationship with Christ alive and growing each day.


1 Corinthians 12:26

The war in Syria has now displaced 13.5 million people and killed more than a quarter of a million (UN figures). The focus this month is on the needs of those caught up in this war.

Pray for -

- An end to this devastating conflict and the restoring of peace to the whole of Syria.
- The 4.8 million Syrian refugees in the countries around Syria and for the 1.1 million Syrians (many children without adult support) seeking asylum in Europe.
- The Christians who have chosen to stay in Syria to serve their communities. One church in Damascus is currently supporting 2000 displaced families.
- The 7 to 8 million children directly impacted by the conflict and for those Christians and others providing many with trauma care.
- The increasing number of people who as the result of receiving care from Christians decide to become Christians themselves, that they will get the nurturing and care needed for them to develop as disciples of Jesus.
- Protection for the Christians who have chosen to stay and who face the very serious threat of being targeted by Islamic extremists who seek to eradicate the church in the Middle East.
